

## Planetary Forecast for July 27-August 2, 2009

*In review...* Leo empowerment showed itself as expected and our president was reported to now having held more press conferences in his first six months in office than President Bush did in his first term. President Obama also inundated the media with daily one-on-one interviews, and grabbing air time with his “special appearances” across the country, all devised to convince Congress and the public that his healthcare plan is a good thing. However, anyone with an ounce of common sense knows a thousand page bill and trillions of dollars is *not* going to “fix” anything.

*This week...Monday, July 27<sup>th</sup>* and we'll begin early with the 12:07 a.m. EDT, trine between Venus (in Gemini) and Jupiter (in Aquarius). This is romance and financing being supported by Air signs, who are gifted in communication and innovation. The problem is, that's followed at 6:11 with another trine between Venus and Chiron (also in Aquarius). It isn't any wiser to play the victim than it is to play the race card. Whatever is going on, not everyone will be supportive of what they hear or what is occurring. At 10:47, Libra Moon sextiles with Mercury (in Leo) to try and assuage disgruntled parties. At 8:28 p.m. EDT, Moon then trines with Jupiter (in Aquarius) indicating some support or at least benevolence. In thirty minutes, however, Moon then trines with Chiron, so we are back pretty much to square one—or worse—and in ninety minutes, Moon then trines with Venus trying to recover lost ground. Do you feel like you've been locked out of closed-door meetings, but will be expected to pay for the room-service bill? That's exactly what it will feel like for some. We'll end the day with the 10:53, Libra Moon trine with Neptune (surprise—in Aquarius). Moon is being long-winded and excessive with flattery knowing full well that in hours she shifts into critical and analytical Scorpio and her ideas may start to resemble Swiss cheese. A good plan is not to overload any project with expenses or useless excess to begin with so that excavation and cost-slashing will be unnecessary.

*Tuesday, the 28<sup>th</sup>* begins early again with the 12:12 a.m. EDT, Libra Moon quincunx with Uranus (in Pisces). We can anticipate thunderstorms and heavy rains where Low Pressure prevails and more back-room shenanigans. The latter may still might not be enough to achieve a goal, so watch the 1:52, Venus (in Gemini) trine with Neptune (in Aquarius) to help with the convincing. As always, though, beware of the tint of those glasses with the pink lenses. They could make navigating costly due to what you can't see. Also know that Moon is weakening, so the whole attempt may be for naught. At 6:54, Moon shifts into Scorpio. By 9:03, Scorpio Moon sextiles with Pluto (in Capricorn), which often happens, or happens within that day when Moon enters Scorpio. Then we have major news events such as children missing, a notorious suspect like William Peterson being finally arrested for the murder of his third wife, an oil spill stretching forty miles in Alaska, the loss within a day or so of Natasha Richardson and Ron Silver, etc. We'll see what develops because the next aspect is not until 4:38 p.m. EDT, when Venus (in Gemini) squares with Uranus (in Scorpio's fellow Water sign, Pisces). That is followed by our last aspect of the day, the 6:00 Moon square with Leo Sun. Some relationship or business deal will hit a brick wall and could end with a fatality. Weather could also bring heavy precipitation where Lows stall out. As for politics, well, stay tuned for tomorrow.

*Wednesday, the 29<sup>th</sup>* has only two aspects. The first at 5:20 a.m. EDT, is Scorpio Moon in a quincunx with Mars (in Gemini). This could be a verbal battle royal. That is followed at 7:03 p.m. EDT, with Moon in sextile with Saturn (in Virgo) indicating that Moon is insisting that law and boundaries be respected and lessons learned. Warning...ultimatums may not be received well. Don't try them unless you're able to back up your threat, or know your opponent better than you know yourself.

**Thursday** the 30<sup>th</sup> gets much busier, since it's clear some think lessons, law, etc. are for other people. At 4:07 a.m. EDT, Scorpio Moon then squares with Mercury (in Leo). This is another way for Moon to tell Leo Sun that he's way out of line. By 4:30, Moon then squares with Jupiter (in Aquarius), which is shades of the same thing--with the addition that someone isn't getting invited to the party after the meeting. At 5:30, we have another Moon square, this time with Chiron (in Aquarius). That's Moon telling everyone to rethink their subsequent "victim" attitude. Some may take that personally and by 6:38, Mercury (in Leo) will oppose Jupiter. At 7:30, Moon then goes into square mode again, this time with Neptune (in Aquarius). Clarity and succinctness is what's valued now. At 8:55 when people are only just at their workplace, Moon trines with Uranus (in Pisces). Let us hope this isn't about an accident or other "event" occurring where people are grouped in greater numbers. At 9:59, Venus then squares with Ceres (in Virgo). This could be a tough day for women/mothers. At 12:56 p.m. EDT, Moon then sextiles with Ceres. Whatever occurred, hopefully it will not be as bad as it could have been. At 1:08, Moon forms a quincunx with Venus, then it's 1:42 when Mercury opposes Chiron. It's not working to try to get what you want using any excuse. By 4:10, Moon shifts into Sagittarius and that lifts the pressure for some, but it can aggravate the bean counters and those responsible for upholding the law.

**Friday**, the 31<sup>st</sup> and the end of July brings four aspects and a planet shift. At 3:47 a.m. EDT, Mercury in Leo opposes Neptune (in Aquarius), which is all Scorpio Moon asked in the first place: quit the drama and speak frankly. At 8:51, Sagittarius Moon will trine with Leo Sun, which rather undercuts Mercury's intentions. The 1:49 p.m. EDT, Mercury quincunx with Uranus (in Pisces) could be the resulting frustration that evolves. At 7:21 Moon then opposes Mars (in Gemini). Sagittarius does not like confrontations and would prefer to operate in back rooms, so while things may seem to calm down, don't be fooled into thinking that nothing is happening. At 9:28, Venus then shifts over into Cancer. Expect people to be considerably more sensitive and even thin skinned. This will not work well with Sagittarius Moon, who prefers at least the image of harmony and cooperation.

**Saturday**, August 1<sup>st</sup> will be slow to start with the 6:48 a.m. EDT, Sagittarius Moon square with Saturn (in Virgo). See? Backroom maneuverings to defy law and lessons. As we're reeling, it will be 3:27 p.m. EDT, when Moon then merrily sextiles with Jupiter (in Aquarius)--that's the spending before the ink is dry, and at 4:52, another sextile with Chiron (also in Aquarius) where Moon acting ultra heroic assures us that we deserve what we are getting because we're so abused. And the 7:02 sextile with Neptune (again in Aquarius) to glue those rose-colored glasses to our scalps. It's not thirty-four minutes before Venus (in Cancer) opposes Pluto (in Capricorn) yelling, "No way am I standing for this!" Our wallets are outraged and frankly some hearts may stop beating in shock for what is going on. We'll close with the 8:31, Moon square with Uranus (in Pisces). The last two times we had this scenario, we had major flooding in China, tornadoes ripped through Colorado, Judge Sotomayor fell and fractured her ankle, Laura Ling and Euna Lee were sentenced to twelve years of hard labor by North Korea, a Disneyworld monorail crashed killing one, and twelve were wounded at a Miami party. Now, of course, Roger Federer also won at Wimbledon, but that doesn't quite balance things out, does it?

**Sunday** the 2<sup>nd</sup> brings us the first aspect at 1:42 a.m. EDT, with Sagittarius Moon doing some fast talking to Mercury (in Leo). That's double Fire energy, confirming speed, but sometimes there's damage done by being too hasty. The Moon-Ceres (in Virgo) square that follows at 2:54 suggests someone gets injured or otherwise loses out as a result. At 4:08, Moon then shifts into Capricorn opening the door for "corrections" to certain matters--for better or worse. At 6:16, Capricorn Moon then conjuncts with Pluto (also in Capricorn). That is the definitive end to something or someone. At 7:27, Moon then opposes Venus (in

**Cancer). Funding is withdrawn and romance is on the chilly side. It's twelve hours (7:07 p.m. EDT) when we end with Mercury shifting into Virgo. If people start to sound more like accountants than impassioned college professors, that's why.
