

## Planetary Forecast for December 10-16, 2007

*In review...* Air energy owned the momentum early on in the week bringing environmental hardship to the Pacific Northwest with winds up to 120 mph. Flooding, mudslides, and power outages followed (Mars is in watery Cancer)--a pattern repeated in the Pacific Southwest later in the week. On Tuesday with critical Air energy in play, an Alaska EMS chopper went missing. The wreckage was located on Saturday with only one victim--the nurse inside; the other three members of the team have not yet been located bringing the hope of survivors in this ordeal. Wednesday's advice to think "safety and self-preservation" when Moon shifted into Scorpio and the psyche of some went too deep into darkness, was horrifically illustrated when a nineteen year-old went up to the third floor of an Omaha, Nebraska mall and opened fire. He killed eight and wounded five before shooting himself. Getting far less media attention was an episode in Detroit where an ex-boyfriend grabbed his former girlfriend and her seven year-old daughter and at a gas station started shooting the mother. The child jumped in front of her mother pleading for her life, took six bullets before the man could be stopped/arrested. Thursday's warning to be travel conscious and safety concerned was oddly illustrated when someone at a Charlotte, North Carolina mall's second-story parking garage hit the wall causing the concrete flooring to collapse and killing the driver. The Uranus "expect the unexpected" momentum applied in France, as well, when a secretary in a law firm opened a package and was killed as it exploded. Then a bomb scare in Montclair State shut down that New Jersey university, while 70 were killed in a Chinese coal mine explosion. Finally, on Sunday as I write this and a New Moon approaches, the warning to act in a cautionary manner didn't get heeded by some; as Sagittarius Moon squares with Uranus (in Pisces) a lone gunman has opened fire at a Christian Missionary Training Center just outside of Denver, Colorado. Four are reported as being shot.

*This week...* Monday, December 10<sup>th</sup> begins with the 10:09 a.m. EST, Sagittarius Moon conjunction with Jupiter (also in Sagittarius). That's a great deal of Fire energy bringing strong brainstorming potential, but also an impulse toward excess with food and libation--this is, after all, the holiday season. Take care with traveling, too; avoid multi-tasking when you should be focusing on the road, and be aware that environmental conditions (wildfires, and fiery wrecks) could also drastically impede commutes. At 10:36, Moon then conjuncts with Pluto (also in Sagittarius), which suggests some won't heed warnings creating a strong potential for physical and financial loss. Moon shifts into Capricorn at 1:50 p.m. EST bringing an atmosphere to be more prudent and to improve on results. People will be thinking more about the "bottom line" and not without some greed or self-serving reasons, so if there's a brusque or even annoyed tone in the air, that's why. Mercury (also in Sagittarius) squares with Uranus (in Pisces) at 7:25 p.m. and that suggests it will be difficult to resolve anything today, so don't expect the writer's strike to end yet, and office gossip, as well as family stress is apt to keep churning.

*Tuesday*, the 11<sup>th</sup> promises to be a busier day with seven aspects beginning with the 3:08 a.m. EST sextile between Capricorn Moon and Venus (in Scorpio) indicating some will gauge wisely and mend fences or keep rhetoric from getting out of hand. At 4:58, Moon then opposes (Mars in Cancer) trying to temper any emotional outbursts and melodramatic conduct. At 6:30, Moon trines with Saturn (in Virgo); another positive sign that progress is better now as we try to follow the rules and give people their due where it's appropriate. At 2:36 p.m. EST, Jupiter (in Sagittarius) conjuncts with Pluto (in Sagittarius) suggesting, as is often the case, that some will not be satisfied and want more. Watch this Fire energy to charge the atmosphere, since at 6:16, Venus (in Scorpio) trines with Mars (in Cancer) creating an atmosphere for heavy precipitation, and angry tears. At 6:57, Moon sextiles with Uranus (in Pisces) a troubling environment at this time. Take care traveling and realize this is a period when those who are stressed, or

unbalanced, could snap. At 10:47, Sagittarius Sun sextiles with Neptune (in Aquarius) again indicating shades of the same momentum, but now having a “pretty spin” put on things--or people lying to cover their tracks.

*Wednesday* the 12<sup>th</sup> as Hanukah ends, we will only have the 2:33 p.m. EST, Venus (in Scorpio ) sextile with Saturn (in Virgo) as Moon prepares to clear the air by moving into Aquarius. It seems like we will be recovering or analyzing yesterday's occurrences and incidents, and striving to rebalance our lives in order to regain stability.

*Thursday*, the 13<sup>th</sup> at 12:01 a.m. EST Moon shifts into Aquarius--like it couldn't wait one more moment to move on. At 1:08 p.m. EST (note the long transition time) Aquarius Moon forms a quincunx with Mars (in Cancer) which looks like an Air-Water clash, and that could bring precipitation trouble where Low Pressure Systems linger, but also relationship trouble. That's followed at 4:15 with a Moon-Saturn (in Virgo) quincunx and that is free-spirited--or rebellious--Aquarius Moon challenging anything and everything that ties one down or hampers choices. Not surprisingly, what follows at 6:52, is Aquarius Moon squaring with Venus (in Scorpio) and at 10:02, Mercury (in Sagittarius) sextiles with Neptune (in Aquarius). Prepare for some not to care about anyone's feelings or interests but their own. At the least this will have you scratching your head, at the worst, it may be time to change the locks on the doors or get a restraining order.

*Friday* the 14<sup>th</sup> begins with the 1:22 p.m. EST, Aquarius Moon conjunction with Neptune (also in Aquarius) bringing plenty of Air energy to dry the atmosphere, but also adds the possibility of some off-the-wall ideas or rhetoric by some. Since this is followed by a 3:27, Moon sextile with Pluto (in Sagittarius) it might be that some decide they don't want any part of those kind of ideas or behavior and opt out; how that occurs (violence or legal endings) is anyone's guess. At 6:35, Moon sextiles with Sagittarius Sun and this Air-Fire blending could encourage some to indulge in an office party romance or romantic get-together elsewhere. Can blackmail or career ruination be far behind?

*Saturday* the 15<sup>th</sup>, Aquarius Moon sextiles with Pluto (in Sagittarius) at 5:33 a.m. EST. At 6:50, Moon then sextiles with Jupiter (also in Sagittarius). If some are continuing to act a little frenetic or excessive, the combination of the year's stresses, debt-taxes, and high expectations--or even greed--may be part of the cracks in the foundation of some. At 8:15, Moon enters Pisces. There's almost a twelve hour adjustment period, then at 7:18 p.m. EST, Pisces Moon trines with Mars (in Cancer) bringing double Water energy. That's another strong chance for precipitation where Low Pressure Systems exist, and some retaliation possibility against recent behavior. There should be no surprises, since our psychic ability and so-called “tuning fork” should be at maximum working order. If you get broadsided, it's because you prefer to hide from the truth or play victim. At 11:50, Moon opposes Saturn (in Virgo), an odd aspect, since Pisces should be more respectful and responsible to laws and justice. If something does go wrong, it's likely to be personal/domestic and Pisces is less apt to use its wisdom under these circumstances.

*Sunday*, the 16<sup>th</sup> Pisces Moon trines at 4:43 a.m. EST with Venus (in Scorpio) bringing double Water energy again. More precipitation concerns for travelers and perhaps some tough love lectures at home. Otherwise, seek to quiet the soul and regroup after what has been a challenging year. At 11:24, Moon conjuncts with Uranus (in Pisces) so stay put and away from conflict where and when you can. Where avalanche concerns are posted, please heed them. We've lost several adventurers already this season--and a veteran surfer in Hawaii when the seasonal big waves appeared. You just don't recover from an eighty-foot slam dunk.  
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
