

Planetary Forecast September 27-October 3, 2010

*In review...*who was the loudest "crazy maker" to take advantage of the full Aries Moon this week? The vote has to be split between Iran's Ahmadinejad speaking to the U.N. and again alleging U.S. culpability for 9/11 and congress for inviting Comedy Central's Stephen Colbert to speak during the immigration hearings. *This week...*communication and relationships take center stage due to Moon entering Gemini and Venus about to turn retrograde (Oct 8th). Monday, September 27th begins with the 5:39 a.m. EDT, Taurus Moon trine with Mercury (in Virgo). The best part of the day should be good for the stock market and reassurance in most things as we strive for stability. There's a long lull until the 7:13 p.m. EDT, Moon square with Neptune (in Aquarius). By 8:06, Moon then also squares with Chiron (again in Aquarius), your typical partnering for those spewing propaganda and other fiction. Hopefully, there's a rejection of going in that route. By 8:54, Moon forms a quincunx with Ceres (in Sagittarius). This could be a tough day for Secretary of State Clinton and women in domestic difficulties; however, at 9:27, Moon sextiles with Jupiter (in Pisces), which looks like a green light if parties are willing to linger and negotiate a bit longer. At 11:03, we end with Moon also in sextile with Uranus (also in Pisces). Anything could happen, from thunderstorms to olive branches where none were expected. The question mark is what is the cost of everything and are we getting good value for what this is all costing?

Tuesday the 28th will begin with Moon entering Gemini at 2:10 a.m. EDT. By 7:33, Gemini Moon will quincunx with Pluto (in Capricorn). See this akin to Caesar being stabbed on the senate steps and arguing with Death, who waits outside of that ring of non-heroes, "Wait! This is a mistake!" Surely in this atmosphere of bad or poor messaging and governing, there is plenty for whoever is marked for voter censure to attempt a few necessary and smart choices. Will it happen? Unfortunately, there are plenty of Caesar-size egos out there to make the odds unappealing. At 12:27 p.m. EDT, Moon will then trine with Libra Sun and that is significant diplomacy and rhetoric. That lays the groundwork for the 4:10, Moon trine with Saturn (also in Libra), indicating a bow to law and border security. However, in minutes Jupiter (in Pisces) squares with Ceres (in Sagittarius) suggesting a sabotage event to be costly. Since there's an 8:04, Moon quincunx with Mars (in Scorpio), payback/retaliation could be hell. This troubling energy continues into tomorrow.

Wednesday, the 29th and Sukkot ends, the Jewish celebration of the exit from the desert. Watch for troubling encounters or statements out of Israel or Palestine (or both) what with the 12:12 a.m. EDT, Gemini Moon quincunx with Venus (in Scorpio) and the 10:30 p.m. EDT, Moon square with Mercury (in Virgo). There are more pronouncements than discussions and they are costly to the wallet and heart. In the U.S. it's more of the same with the elections barely a month away.

Thursday, the 30th and last day of September gets extremely busy as the rhetoric out of Washington D.C. gets sillier and more intellectually insulting. At 3:03 a.m. EDT, Gemini Moon trines with Neptune (in Aquarius). At 3:49, Moon then trines with Chiron (also in Aquarius)--the usual song and dance: "Poor me, poor you" or the equally slanted, "Be afraid, be very afraid." At 4:43, Moon then squares with Jupiter (in Pisces) and by 5:45, opposes Ceres (in Sagittarius). The cycle comes to a head-on collision when Moon squares with Uranus (in Pisces). This is worse than problematic where dialogues are concerned, this is akin to taking a gas pump nozzle, putting it in your mouth and holding hard on the trigger.

At 9:46, Moon shifts into Cancer, whose unhappy job it is to try to find stability and harmony in this caustic and explosive atmosphere. Although this takes a highly evolved crab soul to achieve success, the cost will be high, indicated by the 2:55 p.m. EDT, Cancer Moon opposition to Pluto (in Capricorn). A few areas of success are possible, indicated by the 8:42, Libra Sun conjunction with Saturn (also in Libra). Unfortunately, at 11:40, Cancer Moon squares with Saturn and by 11:52, Moon squares with Sun. That means no, NO, and hell no. We can only hope that those who only like to begin working in this atmosphere step forward with sincerity.

Friday, October 1st and things continue to be busy. We start rather late with the 5:40 a.m. EDT, Cancer Moon trine with Mars (in Scorpio). Along with another strong front bringing heavy --maybe flooding--precipitation, this energy will have some pumped and ready to renovate the house or something equally ambitious as we deal with the deluge of Mars energy. By 7:50, Moon also trines with Venus (also in Scorpio). It could be a romantic day for those in new relationships or seeking one. By 8:32, Mercury (in Virgo) is in quincunx with Neptune (in Aquarius) and someone could be whispering sweet nothings in someone's ear--or someone in Washington D.C. is trying to sell another bill of goods to the public. There's a lull until 2:00 p.m. EDT when Mercury again dittos that maneuver with Chiron (also in Aquarius). Does it work? Hopefully it does if ethics is embraced. The 6:36, Mercury opposition with Jupiter (in Pisces) suggests it does not go well. Too few heroes and statesmen. We end the day with the 9:22, Uranus square with Ceres (in Sagittarius). Those who were lied to or otherwise played for a fool will react with displeasure. And as usual when Uranus and Ceres clash, I worry for those in domestic strife.

Saturday, the 2nd continues our need to be restrained or otherwise careful in communications. We'll start rather slowly (maybe sleeping later due to yesterday's stresses) with the 7:57 a.m. EDT, Cancer Moon quincunx with Neptune (in Aquarius). Ditto that maneuver with Chiron (again in Aquarius) at 8:38. Moon is trying to get to the facts, and while she may succeed (the 9:07 trine between Moon and Jupiter [in Pisces]) that could come at a cost. At 10:23, Mercury (in Virgo) opposes Uranus (in Pisces),

which is the response to Moon's conduct/opinion. Moon doesn't care for that at all and by 11:14 there's a trine with Uranus. Ouch. There might be a moment when things look like they can be salvaged hinted by the 11:21, Moon sextile with Mercury; however, in ten minutes, Moon forms a quincunx with Ceres (in Sagittarius) forcing an issue. It's no surprise that during the noon hour, Mercury squares with Ceres and this should be a signal to those in financial stress or relationship trouble to seek safety and the safety of other family members--which should have been done days ago.

Moon enters Leo at 2:21 p.m. EDT and things continue to stay volatile and impassioned. Sadly, we close with the 7:14, Leo Moon quincunx with Pluto (in Capricorn). This could reflect anything from explosions (both accidental and military related) to pronouncements of divorce and serious health issues. Inevitably, the obituary pages will longer than usual.

Sunday, the 3rd starts with Leo Moon attempting repairs with the 3:53 a.m. EDT sextile with Saturn (in Libra). That's followed at 7:28 with Moon doing the same with Libra Sun. Is it too little too late? If anyone is approachable, it's Libra, who strongly strives to be diplomatic and forgiving. But how often can one be the only one forgiving without real change? At 11:04, Mercury enters Libra giving hope to the communications arena. At 11:40, Leo Moon then squares with Mars (in Scorpio), which brings another "ouch" atmosphere when we were just trying to recover stability. Not surprisingly, by 5:58 p.m. EDT, Venus (in Scorpio) conjuncts with Mars (in Scorpio). Some may find passion for their evening, but others may find a steak knife in the jugular. Those with low pressure systems approaching, expect a deluge including some strong thunderstorms. Be safe and please continue to pray for all those who serve.
