

Planetary Forecast October 25-31, 2010

*In review...*the forecasted "upturn in emotions and tension" did soar this week as NPR fired long-time journalist-commentator Juan Williams, who also happens to be contracted by Fox. Monday, October 25th is ultra busy and starts with a bull's stomp when at 12:11 a.m. EDT, Taurus Moon squares with Neptune (in Aquarius). By 12:31, this is followed by Moon's square with Chiron (also in Aquarius). Moon demands we take off the rose-colored glasses and speak factually and without the whines or lies. If that doesn't happen, there's a 2:50, Moon sextile with Uranus (in Pisces) to make a correction or leak something to stop the nonsense. At 3:40, Moon then opposes Mars (in Scorpio). Moon prefers stability and calm to a rumble, but this is election time and Moon is about to shift, so don't expect too much success there. At 7:47, Moon enters Gemini and the week's volume on rhetoric is about to pierce our eardrums. At 9:17, Mercury (in Scorpio) conjuncts with Venus (also in Scorpio). Along with conversations being laced with plenty of sucrose or arsenic--whichever is needed--watch for flooding conditions to grow worse where Low Pressure advances. At 11:47, Gemini Moon then forms a quincunx with Scorpio Sun. The attempt to out speak and outmaneuver doesn't slow down. Note the 1:51 p.m. EDT, Moon quincunx with Pluto (in Capricorn) as Moon tries to convince a candidate is not "dead in the water." Following is the 4:59, Moon quincunx with Ceres (Also in Capricorn), the 9:29 quincunx with Venus and the final 11:51, Moon quincunx with Mercury. That tells you who is being sold the bill of goods-- Democrat female voters.

Tuesday the 26th has only two aspects, but considering Pluto's presence yesterday and today, two are plenty. At 4:00 a.m. EDT, Gemini Moon trines with Saturn (in Libra). Then at 3:01 p.m. EDT, Scorpio Sun sextiles with Pluto (in Capricorn). As Moon serenades with tales of respect for law and order, by afternoon Sun embraces "endings" with the Great Equalizer. Who is exiting today--more important, why?

Wednesday, the 27th we start late again (at 4:58 a.m. EDT) due to the continuing strong presence of Pluto. Now Gemini Moon squares with Jupiter (in Pisces). Who got a double-barrel dose of the truth/reality yesterday? Not one to give up easily, at 7:52, Moon then trines with Neptune (in Aquarius) to put a "shrug" spin on things, and again at 8:10, with Chiron (as usual also in Aquarius) to point fingers at the bad move/people who shed daylight on gluttony or what is rotten. Should be a classic example of shooting the messenger. At 10:19, Moon then squares with Uranus (in Pisces). This is an attempt to stop a necessary eviction/removal. At 2:35 p.m. EDT, Moon then forms a quincunx with Mars (in Scorpio). You're not going to convince the analyst who's been watching this moment coming for a good while not to keep the momentum going. At 3:14, Moon then shifts into Cancer. By 9:11, Cancer Moon opposes Pluto (in Capricorn). Sentimentalist, Moon isn't ready to say goodbye to much and in this case that could be costly if not counter-productive to the atmosphere. But at 11:36, Moon trines with Sun--seeing the necessity to act with wisdom. Where Low Pressure advances, expect saturating, even flooding rains. Pay attention to dreams and by all means heed intuition.

Thursday, the 28th starts earlier again beginning with the 1:27 a.m. EDT, Cancer Moon opposition with Ceres (in Capricorn). While water and earth clash, this is an unreasonable, emotional collision between troubled energies. This sets a difficult atmosphere for relationships where familial hierarchy issues are an ongoing plight. At 2:05, Moon then trines with Venus (in Scorpio). It's not unusual for Cancers to avoid dealing with problems as they arise, but to scurry around in search of allies. Such frantic activity can create murky waters and poor vision and subsequent choices. At 2:48, Mars shifts over to Sagittarius. The momentum stays fairly stable, at least for the 11:00, Venus sextile with Ceres (also in Capricorn). Watch, however, for the Moon square with Saturn (in Libra) in fourteen minutes. This is an example of the results of poor or destructive alliances mentioned above. The 2:08 p.m. EDT, Moon trine with Mercury (in Scorpio) on face value looks like a good sales pitch, but what lines did Moon cross earlier to make it worthwhile to step back and reconsider signing on the bottom line or getting emotionally involved with people who trigger your antennas' warnings? We end with the 9:10, Scorpio Sun conjunction with Venus (also in Scorpio). Sun is best served following trusted instincts and that will yield projects and funding desired. Friday, the 29th begins late again with the 10:28 a.m. EDT, Cancer Sun trine with Jupiter (in Pisces). For those who have embraced poor judgment or acted with ill will, it would be a waste of energy to remind them of bad karma. At 11:00, Scorpio Sun sextiles with Ceres (in Capricorn) indicating that

regardless of the static in the air, many recognize the seriousness of the bottom line. At 1:32 p.m. EDT, Cancer Moon will quincunx with Neptune (in Aquarius) and that's followed quickly with the 1:49 support of the quincunx with Chiron (also in Aquarius). Is a sneak attack due after the whining, or a dam break with all this water energy? The 3:48, Moon trine with Uranus (in Pisces) indicates the results are difficult. Momentum changes at 8:39 when Moon enters Leo--the change is dryer environmental conditions and more bravado. At 10:56, Leo Moon trines with Mars (in Sagittarius). We go from heavy water energy to fire-fire! Watch for explosive behavior which can mean all-out Shakespearean theatrics in political assertions to terror attacks. Saturday, the 30th brings a Leo Moon quincunx with Pluto (in Capricorn) at 2:26 a.m. EDT. By 4:49, Moon squares with Venus (in Scorpio). At 7:40, Moon forms a quincunx with Ceres (Capricorn). At 8:45, Moon squares with Scorpio Sun. At 4:15 p.m. EDT, Moon sextiles with Saturn (in Libra). Don't doubt the Democrats, particularly the White House will work 28 of the 24 hour day trying to regain lost ground in the political landscape. What's interesting is the final embrace of law and principles. Really? That will be novel indeed.

Sunday, the 31st and Halloween. The day's drama begins with the 1:12 a.m. EDT, Leo Moon square with Mercury (in Scorpio). In just over twelve hours (1:51 p.m. EDT) Moon forms a quincunx with Jupiter (in Pisces). At 5:01, Moon opposes Neptune (in Aquarius) and at 5:17 with Chiron in the same neighborhood. At 7:07, Moon forms a quincunx with Uranus (in Pisces) after setting us up that the poor moonbeam provider is lonely and harmless. At 11:51, Moon enters Virgo, who has plenty of verbal, and literal waste to clean up.
